All pupils in Years 7 – 11 of the Senior School must wear regulation school uniform. All official school uniform is available to purchase online from Schoolblazer.



PHASED NEW UNIFORM

Sports Kit - St Lawrence College phased in new Prep and Senior sports kit from July 2022. Old Sports kit can still be worn until June 2024 as part of the 2 year phasing in period.

School Uniform - St Lawrence College are phasing in a new Prep and Senior School uniform. The new uniform is purchasable from Schoolblazer. During the 2024/2025 academic year, pupils may opt to continue to wear the old uniform, but from September 2025 the new uniform will be compulsory for all pupils.

SENIOR SCHOOL (YEARS 7 – 13)

Expectations and Rules


Pupils are expected to be neatly dressed at all times, both on and off the premises. Extremes of fashion, attire or hair, etc. or those unsuitable for school, or which are likely to bring the school into disrepute, are not permitted.

All uniform must be clearly labelled with the pupil's name and House.

Pupils in Years 7-11 must wear regulation school uniform which is clean, smart and of the correct size. Pupils in the Sixth Form adopt a Business Dress Code which is clarified later on in this guide.

- For Years 7-11 the SLC blazer / jacket is to be worn during the school day, with a white shirt / blouse and charcoal grey trousers / SLC tartan kilt.
- Shirts / blouses must be tucked in and top buttons fastened when a tie is worn.
- The SLC jumper may be worn under the blazer / jacket, but not instead of the blazer / jacket.

Hair Styles, make-up and jewellery

- Hair must be fully tied up for pupils in Years 7 11.
- Obviously dyed hair, which is not a pupil's natural hair colour, is not acceptable. This also applies to extensions and weaves.
- Pupils may not shave their heads shorter than `Grade 4'.
- Boys must be clean-shaven.
- Make-up is not permitted for Kirby pupils (Years 7 & 8). For pupils in Years 9-13 make-up should be discreet and subtle. Nail vanish, if worn at all, should be subtle or nude in colour.
- Other than a single pair of stud earrings, jewellery is not permitted for Kirby pupils (Years 7 & 8).
 - For Years 9-13 a single pair of stud earrings only are permitted during the school day; hooped and dangly earrings are not permitted. In addition, jewellery is limited to one of each of the following items: necklace, bracelet, finger ring.
- Nose studs and facial piercings are not permitted during the school day.

Please note that it is the College's decision what constitutes `acceptable', `unsuitable for school' or `obviously dyed' and if unsure, pupils should seek clarification in advance of any changes that may be in conflict with these rules. Repeated or significant infractions of these rules are likely to result in disciplinary sanctions.

Other points

- For <u>formal occasions</u> including some Sunday Chapel services, Speech Day, concerts, formal lectures and other designated functions, school uniform must be worn.
- For <u>school fixtures</u> (both home and away) pupils should wear school uniform or full College games kit.
- Overcoats and jackets of suitably restrained style and dark blue and black in colour are permissible when weather conditions dictate. Leather jackets and denim jackets are not permitted.
- **Day Pupils** are governed by the above for travelling to and from school; approved protective clothing is permitted for cycling.
- **Scarves:** When the weather conditions dictate, Years 12 & 13 (Sixth Form) may wear a scarf of a single sober colour. Pupils in Years 7-11 may wear the school scarf or a plain dark blue scarf.
- For <u>Theatre visits</u> and similar outings Years 7-10 must wear full school uniform. For Years 11 to 13 smart dress should be worn. <u>Field trips</u> and similar outings may necessitate less formal dress; this will be specified on each occasion.

Students' dress code for meals

- At breakfast and lunch pupils should be in school uniform
- If pupils have to be in school games kit at a meal, they should wear school regulation games kit, including full length tracksuit trousers / leggings.
- Pupils should not wear outdoor clothing to meals **no coats, scarves or headgear.**

Recreational Dress

- These clothes may be of a casual nature but must be clean, smart and acceptable in style and colour.
- <u>Times for Recreational Dress</u> are as follows: Visits into town known as "Town Leave"; Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday after 4.00pm.; Sundays; and after 5.15pm on weekdays unless otherwise instructed by the Housemaster / Housemistress. These times do not apply to day pupils, who must travel home in school uniform.
- **Games Kit.** For Games the proper kit must be worn as detailed in the Clothing List. Sufficient kit must be held to allow for washing and repair. School match kit may not be worn for practice sessions.
- **Choir and Orchestra.** For concerts, members of the Choir and Orchestra should wear white shirts / blouses, with their school uniform.

Naming of Clothes

All items of clothing and possessions should be clearly labelled with name tapes. E.g. for trousers and skirts on the inside waistband, for shirts, blouses and jumpers at the inside back neck.

- (1) Formal, black leather, polishable shoes (not suede or brushed finishes), maximum heel height two inches (not stiletto).
- Overcoats and Jackets should be of suitably restrained style and dark blue and black in colour when weather conditions dictate. Leather jackets and denim jackets are not permitted.

Laundry

The College Laundry provides a machine wash service only and whilst every effort is made to adhere to washing instructions on labels, all laundry is processed at the pupil's risk. It is therefore recommended that no 'hand wash only' items are brought and that items should be both machine and tumble-dryable. All machine washable clothes are laundered free of charge.

A Dry Cleaning service is available at an additional cost.

All garments must be sent in good repair – a charge will be made for mending.

All items of clothing and possessions should be clearly labelled with name tapes. E.g. for trousers and skirts on the inside waistband, for shirts, blouses and jumpers at the inside back neck.

For boarders 50 nametapes will be will be ordered automatically and held by House matrons to ensure name tapes are available and can be sewn into every garment to be laundered.

Overseas Pupils - Uniform and Bedding Deliveries

Pupils joining St Lawrence College are expected to have purchased uniform in advance of arriving at the school. Overseas pupils may get their uniform and/or bedding orders sent directly to the school for collection from their Boarding House on arrival.

If you are selecting this option, all parcels MUST be named correctly to ensure they arrive at the Boarding House. They should be named as follows:-
